"NOW THANK WE ALL OUR GOD" (1636) Today's Song of Praise to God - #525 in the Blue Hymnal

This hymn is the first one in our bulletin today and was written by Martin Rinkart (1586-1649), a Lutheran pastor in Eilenberg, Saxony. He began his work as the Thirty Years' War was raging through Germany. Floods of refugees streamed into the walled city of Eilenberg. The Swedish army encompassed the city gates and inside there was nothing but plague, famine, and fear.

There was a tremendous strain on the pastors, who expended all their strength in preaching the gospel, caring for the sick and dying, and burying the dead. One after another, the pastors themselves took ill and perished until at last only Martin Rinkart was left. Some days he conducted as many as fifty funerals.

Finally the Swedes demanded a huge ransom. It was Martin Rinkart who left the safety of the city walls to negotiate with the enemy, and he did it with such courage and faith that there was soon a conclusion of hostilities, and the period of suffering ended. Rinkart, knowing there is no healing without thanksgiving, composed this hymn for the survivors of Eilenberg. It has been sung around the world ever since.
