THE GIVING TREE

Again this year we are partnering with other churches in Mount Joy to provide Christmas gifts for children referred to us by the Donegal School District.

Our goal as churches is to show the love of Christ in a very practical way. A card is placed in each bag of gifts sharing that God gave the greatest gift in his son Jesus. We also invite them to church with the name listed of each church participating in the program.

There are some changes to the program. For questions contact Nancy Duquette.

- 1. Each child will receive 4 gifts 2 clothing and 2 fun
- 2. We have committed to blessing 7 children or a total of 28 gifts.
- 3. Donations of \$20 or more, if desired, are needed to purchase coats. We have committed to 2 donations. Last year St. Marks Women's Ministry purchased over 200 coats. They do not have funds to do that again. Instead letters have been sent to local businesses for donations and each church is asking for donations. Coats are given out as soon as it gets cold. We do not wait until Christmas. So we have been asked to send the donations as soon as possible so coats can be purchased and given out. If shopping is difficult for you and you want to participate, this is a great option for you. To give to the coats drive for the Giving Tree, please note on your check or envelope with cash in it, that it is for Giving Tree coats and put it in the offering plate. Deb will forward the donations. There are no tags on the tree for coats. They are all for gifts. Thank you.
- 4. We will give out large rolls of gift wrap when families pick up the gifts. If you can donate any, it would be appreciated.
